# Flower of the month

Common Name: Golden Penda

Scientific Name: Xanthostemon chrysanthus

Genus: Xanthostemon

Family: Myrtaceae

#### Kingdom: Plantae

Golden Penda is an evergreen rainforest tree native to Queensland. Known for its showy golden blossoms this is a medium sized tree growing to approx. 8-15m in a garden situation, it is useful as a screen, windbreak, nature strip planting and specimen tree. It has glossy dark green leaves and a non-invasive root system. There are also dwarf varieties available.


### **Airport Garden Report**

Do you remember way back in February we were washed out when we planned to go to -Mullaway, Arrawarra Beach and Corindi Beach? Well, we have that special treat for you organised for the last Thursday in May, the 25th.

**10:00am**. Meet at Mullaway Beach and Headland Reserve for Morning Tea. Bring a chair if you'd like to sit otherwise ifs a meander to a shady spot to gaze to the beach while chatting and sipping your tea. To get there - from Solitary Islands Way, turn into Mullaway Drive, Mullaway Public School is on your left. Follow the road for around 1 km to the beach and BBQ parking spot.
